#### **DECLARATION OF STEVEN M. BRONSON**

I, Steven M. Bronson, declare as follows:

- 1. I am an attorney with Smoger & Associates, and counsel for Plaintiff Alexander Gurevich and the Class in the above captioned case, entitled *Alexander Gurevich*, *et al. v. Royal Ambulance*, *Inc.*, *et al.*, Case Nos. RG12631895 (Lead case) and RG12639791, I am licensed to practice before all of the Courts of the State of California and State of Missouri.
- 2. I have personal knowledge of the facts stated herein and if called as a witness, I could and would competently testify to the following under oath.
  - 3. This declaration is submitted in support of the Motion for Attorney's Fees and Costs.
- 4. I have been integrally and actively involved in the prosecution of the above entitled case since its inception in May of 2012 (over 4 years.)
- 5. **Exhibit 1**, attached hereto, is a true and correct copy of my Curriculum Vitae, with respect to my standing in this case to request fees at the hourly rate requested here.
- 6. My hourly rate for this action is \$600.00, which is a reasonable rate for the San Francisco community, in light of the complexity and skill required in this matter, and my training and experience. The above billing rate is comparable and at times even lower than the billing rates charged by lawyers similarly experienced, as well as those who are less experienced, who work at large defense oriented law firms, including many of the prominent firms against whom I typically litigate against. I have cross-referenced this hourly rate with my understanding of the so-called "Laffey Matrix" and this cross-reference further supports the reasonableness of this hourly rate in a class action case.
- 7. In several approved class action settlements in federal court several years ago, I have submitted my time to the court at an hourly rate of \$475.00, and thus my current rate has modestly increased over the course of two to four years. These cases include, but are not limited to, *In re Wachovia Corp. "Pick-A-Payment" Mortgage Marketing and Sales Practices Litigation, Case No. M:09-CV-2015-JF* (N.D. Cal. 2011) (*see* Doc. Steven M. Bronson was named <u>Public Justice Foundation</u>'s "2012 Trial Lawyer of the Year". He was also named "2011 Lawyer of the Year" and "2009 Lawyer of the Year Honoree" for the State of Missouri, by <u>Missouri Lawyers Media</u>. He has been recognized as a "Young Attorneys Finalist" in 2012 and "Top Attorneys" semi-finalist in 2013 by <u>The Daily Transcript</u> in San Diego. In 2014 and 2015, he was selected to <u>Super Lawyers</u> for Missouri. He is in private practice, representing injured consumers and victims. Mr. Bronson represents children exposed to toxic substances, including lead and other toxins. These cases involve representing consumers who were defrauded into purchasing Option ARM loans. Banks and lenders originated these loans using loan documents that failed to disclose, among other things, that the loan's principal balance was guaranteed to increase, rather than decrease, with each payment made, resulting in a loss of equity in the home.

In addition to his private practice, Mr. Bronson volunteers his time to the public interest. In the past, he wrote on *amici* briefs to the United States Supreme Court, supporting the positions of the editors of the New England Journal of Medicine in *Wyeth v. Levine*; the American Medical Association, American Cancer Society, and eight other national public health groups in *Altria v. Good*; and forty renowned marine biologists, lead by Jean-Michel Cousteau, in *Exxon v. Baker*. He has also received awards for completing pro bono work in San Diego.

Mr. Bronson earned his Bachelor's Degree from the University of Wisconsin— Madison, before he undertook graduate studies at California Western School of Law, where he received his Juris Doctor's Degree.
